

UGA is tied for 20th in U.S. News & World Report's 2009 list of the 50 top public universities in America. The rankings are based on factors such as academic reputation, student retention, faculty resources, student selectivity and financial resources.

Kiplinger's magazine ranks UGA 7th on its list of best values among 100 public colleges and universities in America. Schools on the list—chosen on the basis of academic quality, cost and financial aid—are places "where students can receive a stellar education without graduating with a mountain of debt," according to the magazine.

UGA is 9th among 345 public and private colleges on the Princeton Review's "Best Academic Bang for your Buck" list. The rankings are based on an analysis of academic and cost-related factors.

The School of Law is tied for 32nd among the nation's 100 top accredited law schools in rankings compiled by U.S. News & World Report magazine. The school is tied for 11th among the nation's public law schools and is one of the top four public law schools in the South.

The doctoral program in rhetoric in the Speech Communication department is ranked 1st in the nation in a survey conducted by the National Communication Association. The survey was conducted among some 7,100 educators, practitioners and students in the U.S. and more than 20 other countries

National Debate Tournament

NDT Qualifiers: 1967-1977, 1990-2008. UGA has qualified two teams for the NDT in 13 separate years, and has qualified three teams for the NDT in four separate years.

NDT Elimination Rounds: UGA has had 16 different teams in the elimination debates at the NDT, and has had at least one team in the elims 11 out of the last 18 years.

In 2007, UGA won the Rex Copeland Award, given to the top First Round At Large Bid to the NDT.



UGA reached the NDT final round in 1997. Georgia is one

of six programs to have two teams reach the semifinals of the NDT in the same season.
